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1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Introductory Note

Pravin Khodke Memorial Trust was established in 1999. Its main motto was to cater to the educational need of the rural area. The trust was established by Mrs. Sulbha Sanjay Khodke in the fond memory of Late Shri Pravin Khodke who faced an untimely death at a very young age. The trust works on the social, educational and environmental issues. It runs some Higher secondary school, Junior college along with three-degree colleges in the region of Amravati. Since last 25 years the trust is organizing state level grand Flower show in the city of Amravati to make aware the citizens about the environment conservation.

In 2007-08 Vinayak Vidnyan Mahavidyalaya was established considering the dire necessity of science and commerce college at Nandgaon Khandeshwar. Since its inception it is getting appreciable response which is obvious from its increasing number of students every year. Our college is affiliated to Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University, Amravati. Nandgaon Khandeshwar is a tahsil place(Taluka) in Amravati district. It is an underdeveloped area there was no other science college in the periphery of 35 kms before the establishment of our college. Presently also there is no other HEI institute for Science and Commerce streams. Hence our college truly fulfills the need of the students who want to take their degree in science and commerce and who cannot go to district place due to their financial constraints. The college owns 5.44 acres with required infrastructure including classrooms, laboratories, library, playground and green campus. It is certified with ISO 9001:2015. Highly qualified and motivated staff is an important strength of the institute. The library is self-content and has sufficient books to fulfill the need of students. The institute has a NSS unit with 100 students (50 girls and 50 boys). Our college provides co-education. The institute has a lush green campus with a botanical garden. Institute is highly involved in extension and outreach activity for societal development. Our college conducts various extension and outreach activities to inculcate the sense of social responsibility in the students.

Vinayak Vidnyan Mahavidyalaya, Nandgaon Khandeshwar, District Amravati is affiliated to Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University, Amravati. The Institute has clearly defined its vision and mission statements that integrate the current education policy. The institution offers 2 U.G. programmes i.e. B.Com. B.Sc. Semester pattern is introduced in all programs. College, in-tune with the university academic calendar, prepares annual academic calendar and keeps adherence with it. For effective curriculum delivery and transaction, the college provides a strong support mechanism in the form of ICT and enriched library with online resources. Most of the programs provide experiential and participative learning through projects, internship, industrial visits, survey, educational tours, and case study. Continuous evaluation is done through seminars, workshops, group discussions, college unit tests and practicals. The Institute has organized add on courses, skill development courses for students across all departments. While revision of the curriculum, the latest development in the subject and the feedback received from all the stakeholders are considered and conveyed to University. Academic flexibility is provided through elective/ CBCS Pattern for B.Sc. I and B.Com. I from academic session 2022-23. Institute conducted internal academic audit and submitted its report to the College Development Committee for appropriate considerations. The curriculum takes care of overall development of the students. All cross cutting issues such as human values, professional ethics, gender sensitization and environment sustainability through different courses have been integrated in the curriculum. Stakeholder's feedback system is effectively implemented. Feedbacks are helpful for revision, redesign and to enhance learning effectiveness.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

Teaching -Learning and Evaluation

The admission process is transparent and follows the rules prescribed by S.G.B.A. University, Amravati. Eligibility criteria prescribed by Parent University is followed. The reservation policy of the government of Maharashtra is observed. Average percentage of enrolled students is 69.66 % in assessment period. Average percentage of seats filled against seats reserved for various categories of students is 84.96 % in the assessment period. The departments actively conduct counselling sessions and tests to identify the level of learners. The teachers plan their lecture and activities according to the learners' approach hence advance and slow learners are provided with appropriate academic feed to progress. More emphasis is given on experiential learning like laboratory teaching, field and industrial visits. Our institute is a registered local Chapter (LC-4054) for NPTEL-SWAYAM hence students are encouraged to take courses from above platform. Teachers have been using ICT based tools and platforms like Google Class Room, Zoom etc, to facilitate the teaching, learning and evaluation process. The college has 22 permanent faculty members, out of them 18 are Ph.D. and 4 are NET. Three full time ad-hoc based faculty members are appointed by management. The mentor mentee ratio is 1:24 in the academic session 2021-22. Being an affiliated college, evaluation of academic performance of the students is done by the college within the framework of the university. Programme and course outcomes of all programmes are communicated to students through Induction program. Evaluation of the students' academic performance is carried out through seminars, college internal assessment examination, university theory and practical examinations. Internal assessment examination committee of the college plans and implements the process of internal assessment. Average pass percentage of students is 69.94 % in the assessment period.

Research, Innovations and Extension

Research Innovations And Extension

The institute has a well-defined and published research promotion policy. Faculty members are encouraged and financially supported to determine, accomplish and explore the research. The effective implementation of annual performance appraisal system encourages faculty members to boost their teaching, research, and administrative skills. Faculty members are continuously motivated to undergo professional development programs and organize and participate in Conferences, Seminars and Workshops. Leave is granted and financial support is provided for research publication, membership fees, national/international conference fees. Teaching and non-teaching staff are encouraged to upgrade their qualifications and pursue part-time Ph.D. programs.

Human Resources: The institute recruits dynamic & highly qualified faculty to mentor and channelize the young minds. Institute has taken an initiative to encourage the faculty members to pursue their Ph.D work. Faculty are also encouraged to participate in various skill enhancement programs under govt. schemes.

Research infrastructure: The College has sufficient facility to carry out research in the field of science and commerce. The faculty members write research projects and submit it to various supporting agencies like DRDO, DST, DBT, SERB, ISRO, CSIR etc. IQAC is constantly trying to create research culture among faculty members and students.

Organization-Institute and Institute-Institute MoU and Research Collaborations: The institution has 12 active MoUs with other academic institutes and non-academic organizations which sets out opportunities for students through Faculty Exchange Programme and invited expert academician through guest lectures on important topics. Many job-oriented courses are offered in cooperation with Career Katta for students and unemployed graduates. The institute has active MOUs with government local bodies like Tahsil Office and Panchayat Samiti office which help to implement the social activities for the betterment of the society. We have five research collaborations with other institutes.

Extension Activities: The college has NSS, NCC and Green Army Club wings to carry out various extension activities related to the society which ultimately leads to the social and holistic development of the students. Some of the programs are Eco-friendly Green Ganesha Rally, Voter's Awareness Campaign, Swachhata Pakhawada, AIDS Awareness programme, Pulse Polio Campaign, Plantation Drive, Blood Donation Camp, Covid-19 vaccination drives, Eco-friendly Raksha Bandhan etc.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

Infrastructure and Learning Resources -

The college has adequate infrastructural facilities and amenities in the campus. The institute is spread over 5.4 acres of land with built up area of 25,700 sq ft. For teaching-learning process college have ventilated classrooms, three ICT class rooms, free broadband internet facility, library, play-ground, gymnasium, open stage. The library is rich enough with books, reference books, dictionary, journals and spacious reading room, reference section, students' access center. The library is fully automated with E-granthalaya software with the application of bar-code technology. It has a subscription of e-books and e-journals via INFLIBNET. We have subscribed to our university consortium of E-books and E-journal by paying annual subscription where we get access to 7000+ books and 7000+ journals of SGBAU. In institute other facilities are also available such as water cooler, Vinayak student's consumer store, sanitary napkin vending machine, canteen etc. The institute has installed CCTV cameras monitoring purpose and fire extinguisher for safety. The institute has provided

special ramps for easy movement of differently-abled students. The college administrative office updated its IT facilities regularly by increasing the number of computers, printers, scanners, LCD projectors, Xerox machines, etc. There are sufficient numbers of computers in lab. There is optimal utilization of infrastructure and physical facilities in the college. Besides this, we also make available it to local, social NGO, government agency for organizing different programs. All the physical, academic, and support facilities are augmented and maintained through various college committees such as College Development Committee, Library Committee, Purchase Committee, Campus Discipline and Cleanliness Committee, etc.

Student Support and Progression

The percentage of students who are benefited from scholarships and free ships by the government and non-government agencies and the philanthropist during the last 5 years is 79.17. Vinayak Vidnyan Mahavidyalaya Nandgaon Khandeshwar is fully devoted to the up-gradation of the students in every possible way. About 79.17% of students avail of scholarships from state and Central governments. The college provides institutional scholarships to the students. The college also supports economically weaker students by providing them with monetary support for admission, University exam fees, etc. The college has taken initiative to develop and encourage students to be successful, in that record the college has conducted 05 soft skill programs, 04 language and communication skills Programmes, 09 life skill health and hygiene-related programs, and 04 ICT and computing training programs. College is continuously taking efforts to guide students regarding competitive exams about 74.60 % of students benefited from the guidance offered by the institute. The college has a sensitive approach towards the transparent mechanism for timely redressal of student grievances with the help of the Grievance Redressal Cell, Anti Ragging Committee, SC, ST Committee Internal Complaint Committee as per state and University directives. College is trying to stay connected with all its pass-out students. It's proud to say that more than 40.88% of students are placed and progressed to higher education in the last five years. The figure could have been better but most of the students were not reachable. As the college runs undergraduate courses most of our students are interested to join civil services and state government exams. The college conducts regular classes for them. We are very sorry to state that none of our students have qualified for these exams due to fewer opportunities due to the pandemic period. The college provides all types of facilities to enthusiastic students in the field of sports and cultural events. Some of our students added the feathers to the cap of college, and about 19 achievements have been recorded during the last five years. College gives equal importance to extracurricular activities like sports and culture. The college has organized 114 events in which students of the college participated during the last five years. The college has a registered alumni association that contributes through their experience and knowledge to the current students.

Governance, Leadership and Management

The institute adhered the vision and mission of the parent management. The institute practices decentralization and participative management through the working of various committees and cells like, College Development Committee (CDC), Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Internal Complaint Committee (ICC), Grievance redressal committee, etc. The institute prepares a perspective plan for the development and improvement of the quality education. All the service rules related recruitment and promotion are followed as per the guidelines of the statutory bodies. The college has adopted e-governance in Administration, Finance, Accounts and Students'

Admissions. There is provision in financial budget for the various department and their curricular and co-curricular activities. The IQAC conducts the academic audit of all the departments and financial audit is done by an external auditor annually. The performance appraisals of the teaching staff are collected at the end of every academic year through the format provided by the parent university. The Institute has taken many welfare measures for the teaching and non-teaching staff. The college encourage faculty members to participated in faculty development program such as refresher course and orientation programs. And financial assistance is also provided to the staff for attending staff development programs, Conferences, Workshops, Seminars, etc. IQAC is proactive in implementing reforms in teaching-learning processes and in reviewing the feedbacks from all the stakeholders. The IQAC organizes awareness programs/workshops on the NAAC methodology for teachers, other useful workshops, seminars for the students. The institute has made significant improvements and got recognition in last five years. The institute receives salary grants from Government of Maharashtra and research grants from various agencies like UGC, DBT, DST etc.

The Internal Complaints Committee handles cases of sexual harassment. Till date no any incidence of sexual harassment happened. As a result of the nation-wide and state-wide lockdown, field visits, study tours and group activities were not possible during the COVID-19 pandemic, teaching activities were conducted in an online mode.

2.5.1 Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient

I) Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and variety

- Students are briefed through faculty-wise opening addresses in orientation programmes by the Principal /Coordinator / Head of Department about internal assessment, question paper patterns and university examinations.
- Unit tests are conducted by all teachers at the end of each unit of syllabus. The teachers make sure that the pattern of the questions is varying for different units. The internal examinations are also conducted for practical courses.
- Evaluation methods and examination schedules are made available on the college Notice board and college website .
- Internal examination schedule is displayed on notice board in advance.
- The internal assessment mark lists are displayed on the notice boards.
- The subject teacher briefs the students in the classroom about their attendance and performance in the internal examinations..
- Students are free to interact with the teacher to resolve grievances if any, regarding the assessment.

II) *Mechanism to deal with examination related grievances is transparent, time-bound and efficient* Response:

Mechanism is prepared by Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University for any type of grievances of students about exams results. College helps students for seeking photocopies of answer scripts with reassessment and re-counting of marks.

The college maintains complete transparency in the evaluation and to provide platform for redressal of grievance of students regarding to University examination and internal evaluation respectively. To address all examination and evaluation related problems, the Institute has appointed College Examination

Grievance Committee as per the directives of Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University.

Mechanism for Redressal of Grievance regarding External Evaluation by the University:

A. Before Examination:

Common grievances of students before the examination are late application form filing, non-receipt of admit card (hall-ticket) of examinations or wrong entries in the same. In either case, grievances are communicated to University Examination Section and resolved at the earliest. College Exam Officer helps the student for filing the application form.

B. During Examination:

Committee Instant reports to University Examination Section, if there are any grievances regarding question papers of any subject. Grievances regarding question paper include questions asked out of syllabus, typing errors, etc. Sometimes, seat numbers of students are added wrong subject roll lists, so College Grievance Committee instantly give them correct question papers. Roll lists are also corrected at the same time in consultation with university.

C. After Result Declaration

After result declaration by university, if any student has objection with result, he/she comes to Grievance Committee. Committee addresses their issues. Sending an application to university for photocopy of answer script, revaluation and recounting of marks etc. options are provided to students to exercise. Assistance is provided to students to make an online application for the photocopy of the assessed answer-sheets from the University within a particular time frame. After receiving photocopies, if students are not satisfied about their marks, he/she may apply for revaluation. The application is forwarded to university for corrective action.

Direct assessment includes the semester-end examination conducted by the Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University. Indirect assessment includes class tests, mid-semester examinations, home assignments, project assignments, laboratory assignments, viva voce, and student feedback. The degree of attainment of COs is expressed in terms of the level of attainment, and the benchmarks defined for the measurement of attainment levels for undergraduate courses are as follows:

The term “college infrastructure” refers to things like buildings, playgrounds, libraries, laboratories, and other facilities. Infrastructure contributes to a positive learning environment for the students. The classrooms, playgrounds, libraries, toilets, drinking water facility; Science Lab etc. are the most important aspect of college infrastructure. We have adequate infrastructural facilities and amenities in the campus. The institute is spread over 5.44 acres of land with built up area of 25738 sqft. The institution has good infrastructural and physical facilities. Classrooms- 7, laboratories-5, seminar hall-1, computer laboratory-1 are well constructed as per the UGC norms. We have three ICT class rooms, library, playground, gymnasium. The library is rich enough with spacious reading room, reference section, students’ access center. The library remains open from 10.20 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. The library poses 2659 books, 255-reference, 3 dictionary and encyclopedias. Reputed journal of various subject was subscribed annually. There is E-granthalaya software for library automation. We have subscribed to our university consortium of E- books and E-journal by paying annual subscription where we get access to 7000+books and 7000+journals of SGBAU. In institute other facilities are also available - Vinayak students consumer store in which uniform, stationary material is available for the students in reasonable rates.

The institute has installed CCTV cameras for safety and monitoring purpose. The institute has provided special ramps for easy movement of differently-abled students. Our college is the only one college that provides higher education in the stream of science and commerce faculty. So, our aim is to provide quality education to our students. College provides the facilities such as classrooms with ICT facilities, well-equipped laboratories, medical facility. There is an open stage to facilitate and encourage cultural activities. There are sufficient numbers of computers in lab. Various Sports Activities are organized in the big playground with 400 meter running track. From District Sports office of

Amravati (Government of Maharashtra) we have received Gym equipment’s worth of Rs. 700000 Lakhs and it is available for the students and teachers at free of cost in college hours. We allowed the used of our infrastructure for various local, social NGO such as blood donation camp, awareness program any other program which is asked by Government agency arrange for social cause. We allow an NGO that works for help of aspiring MSPC candidates to use our infrastructure free of charges after college hours. In the open area of our college campus, we have established a regular compost making unit which is utilized in the garden. We provide furniture (desk and bench) to the nearby college for the conduction of university examination. We have water cooler with filter to provide facility of pure drinking water for the students.

Response:

The central library of the College was established in 2007, since then library has made consistent progress in terms of collection of books, periodicals, e-resources and services. The college library has furnished room of 1110.00 sq. ft area.

The Library provides e-learning environment to interested readers. They are used in actual teaching. The library is automated using ILMS software named 'E-GRANTHALAYA' with full version of 3.0 with all modules like acquisition, circulation, books issue and return process etc. Separate webpage is created on the college website in word press format to update the happenings and new arrivals of the library regularly. The separate library user number is issued to all the students and faculty members for issuing text books, reference books and journals. Separate computer is provided to the library users for searching the books on Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) in the library. OPAC is also available on library website. User can access OPAC on his own desktop/smart phone.

The separate library portal is created on the website for the students, it contents digital repository of syllabus, previous year question paper set, e-thesis, online open access resources, competitive exam resources, online newspaper clippings etc. The library is having active membership of SGBAU Library Consortia it gives access of INFLIBNET N-LIST consortia, Science-Direct, ELESVER, and provides 7000+ e-journals and 7000+ e-books of various subjects. This is user ID and Password based facility for all faculty members with students.

The college has very enriched in terms of availability of reference books and text books. The library has total 2659 text and reference books for undergraduate courses, 14 Journals, and 5 newspapers. We are continuously adding books, journals/periodicals of

rupees 1 lakh approximately every year. Following are the details of purchased year wise:

Our institute are equipped with sufficient computers and internet connectivity. The IQAC take time to time feedback from the system administrators of the college on the existing IT facilities, quality of services and requirements to meet future needs. After the review, necessary actions are recommended to the college development committee. The college has been consistently making efforts to improve upon IT infrastructure and facilities as per recommendations. The internet connection is upgraded to the plan titled “FIBER RUBY” of Bharat Sanchar Nigam Limited (BSNL) having speed up to 300 MBPS till 6500 GB having rental of Rs 4499/- per month and it covers all teaching departments and units of the college under Wi-Fi and wired internet. Biometric attendance machine is also established. Through the Wi-Fi internet facility, the college faculty can access during teaching for deeper and wider knowledge. Every Department is given QR Code. Students can scan the QR code to access the updated information about the Departments. During Covid period lectures were engaged on Google and Zoom platform. You Tube Lectures are also uploaded by the faculty members. The library provides e-learning environment to interested readers. They are used in actual teaching. The library is automated using ILMS software named 'EGRANTHALAYA'(Free and Open-Source) with full version of 3.0 with all modules like acquisition, circulation, books issue and return process and OPAC etc. There are 7000+ e-books and 7000+ e-journals available subscribed through N-List for teachers and students. The library has a total three computers out of which one computer is for Library software and two for e-resource access purpose. The administrative section has been provided improved hardware and software supports to keep the connectivity seamless. We are trying to increase number of computers, LCD projectors, printers and scanners and Xerox Machine. The College campus is under CCTV surveillance and Campus ERP for college administration. In our institute, there are two courses in which computer subject are taught. So there is special computer lab for the subject having 38 computers and two computers for Eresource in the Library. Three Smart Classrooms (ICT) To make teaching-learning process effective three Smart Classrooms are available in the college equipped with all the ICT facilities. College Website The college website is updated with all the information about administration, Departments, Various activities conducted by the Department and facilities available in the college. There are three Projectors in the ICT classrooms. As per requirement, PCs are purchased. All the PCs available in the college are protected with antivirus. The Annual Maintenance Charges for E-Governance, ERP, LMS, System Software are paid annually.

6.4 Financial Management and Resource Mobilization

6.4.1 Institution has strategies for mobilization and optimal utilization of resources and funds from various sources (government/ nongovernment organizations) and it conducts financial audits regularly (internal and external)

Response:

Mobilization of Funds: Our institute is financially aided by the Government of Maharashtra. So, our financial resources are salary, admission, tuition, other fees are collected by the college from the students and the other fund is generated through bank interests, fines, breakages, common dues, and the fees charged for the issue of certificates. We have also received donation from management for financial support. For optimum utilization of financial resources, the college has constituted purchase and internal audit committee. The planning is done by the management in consultation with the principal and other members in college development committee. The parent institute has appointed a registered chartered accountant for internal financial audit. The budgetary provisions are approved by the college development committee. All the departments are bound to follow the budgetary provision for the optimum utilization of funds. The accountant maintains all the accounts as per account norms. For purchasing process, the quotations are invited for the purchase of all the items. These quotations are scrutinized by the purchase committee of the college. The comparative statements are placed before the committee. After going through the rates, quality of the items and negotiations the purchase committee finalizes the orders for purchasing. With regards to the building construction the management follows the same process. It looks after the quality of material and construction. The fees are collected from the students as per the university directives and utilizes under the proper heads. Departmental budgetary provisions are communicated to the of the departments for purchasing of consumable and non-consumable items. As per the intuitional requirement the management provides financial supports for infrastructural as well as academic development. Recently we have received research grants of Rs. 2.25 lakh for the project from Rajiv Gandhi science and technology commission. The grant is utilized as per guidelines laid down by the university. Academic and infrastructural resources are optimally utilized. The college academic work is in single shift i.e. from 10.30 to 5.30 pm. The classrooms are provided to conduct various Government and non-government functions. College has received Sports Gym equipment from Sports Department of Government of Maharashtra worth of Rs. Seven lakhs. The gymnasium is available for all college students.

Our college provided space for corona vaccination center during Corona pandemic. Our classrooms are available for the NGO to conducting competitive exam classes after the college hours. Grants for carrying out various academic programs like seminars, conferences, workshops, received from Indian Science Congress, Red Ribbon club etc. The Obstetrics and Gynecological Society, Amravati (OBGYS) an NGO who is working for Women Empowerment has sponsored funds for purchasing sanitary napkin Vending Machine. Our affiliating University under Purified Water Scheme sponsored Water Cooler to the college. Examination grant is received from the affiliated university. EBC and other scholarship grants are received from the Government of Maharashtra.

Response:

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of our college was to maintain and enhance the quality of education. The main motto of IQAC is to develop a system for innovative, consistent and improvement in the performance of the institution. It also stresses the improvement in the quality of education. We IQAC established in the year 2017 but at that time there was only a single full-time teacher in the college and rest of the teaching staff was working on clock hour basis. In the year 2020, we reconstituted our IQAC as there was a recruitment of 20 new full-time teachers with permission of the Government of Maharashtra. Since then, IQAC has been taken the following initiatives on a regular basis: 1. Online feedback system is introduced for feedback on curriculum, teaching learning which is analyzed and Improvement in quality of teaching and research by regular inputs to all concerned based on feedback from students. 2. Best practices were established in administration for efficient resource utilization and better services to students and staff were. 3. Practice of Academic and Administrative Audit was initiated and on the basis of which improvement was suggested wherever necessary. 4. The IQAC plays a very important role in maintaining and enhancing the quality of the institution and suggests quality enhancement measures to be adopted.

The IQAC regularly meets every three months and record its minutes and suggestion received from members. The institute has well defined policy for the quality assurance which is ensured by the effective participation from all the stakeholders. The IQAC prepares, evaluates and forwards its suggestion to governing authorities of the institutes in the CDC meeting. IQAC has strongly upheld the use of ICT tools in the teaching learning process. IQAC always encourage teachers to utilize these tools in classroom teaching and laboratories. It has also recommended the authorities to enrich ICT infrastructure by purchasing ICT tool and broad band Wi-Fi facility. IQAC insists the teachers and non- teaching staff to attend various workshops to learn Google Apps, Video conferencing, use of e-mail, handling ICT

instrument etc. For online resources to be made available for students, the college is using SWAYAM-NPTEL etc. Learning management system is introduced and Google classrooms are put into practice. IQAC took efforts to acquire ISO certification for the institute and now we have received ISO 9001-2015 certification. The IQAC take academic audit of each department and various committee every year to increase and maintain the quality of education. Academic audit committee is set up for this purpose. At the beginning of academic session, the committee ask for proposed academic plan including publication, extension activity, collaboration, innovative and best practices, assignment, ICT based activity, students' competition, seminar and workshop. The Committee evaluates the plan submitted by the departments and committees. The committees review their performance at the end of the session. The report of the committee was submitted to the IQAC and the same is put in the College Development Committee for discussion, suggestion and approval. Due to implementation of such academic audit, it is found out that all departments and committees have been constantly improving their curricular, co-curricular and extra cocurricular performances.

7.2 Best Practices

7.2.1 Describe two best practices successfully implemented by the Institution as per NAAC format provided in the Manual

Response:

Objectives :Environment degradation is one of the most burning issue at global level. As a citizen's of India, it's our prime duty to act responsible to make the mother Earth a healthier and better place to live. As an Educational institute, the Students and faculty members of the college in both their campus and beyond by starting to small efforts to stop the degradation of the environment.

Context: The College is located in NandgaonKhandeshwarTahsil which is one of the talukas of the Amravati district. There is lack of town planning and the area has not been modified adequately to deal with the increasing demands of the population. Due to which, the people of this village suffer from Poor sewerage, pressure on water resources, lack of greenery, discontinuous electric supply, unhygienic environment and vehicular pollution. In spite of the limited resources, the college has started the practice under the name of “**One Step towards the Mother Earth**”.

Practice: To implement the practices, Green Army Club organized Green Literacy programs to spread the message of environment protection. The following programs were set for adopting and encouraging the students to start green initiative.

1. **Vanmahotsav** – was celebrated in the first week of July, the students planted some indigenous species of trees to make the campus green and beautiful. **VrukshaDindi** is regularly organized. The main intention of the rally was to inspired the citizens of the town to grow trees and conserve it.
2. **Eco-Friendly Rakshabandhan** – As we know Raksha-Bandhan is to celebrate the bond between brother and sister and environment and human have the same relationship. Keeping this concept in mind the club have made eco-friendly Rakhi's from seeds of trees like Gunj, Gulmohar, Ashoka, Bahava, apta, tamarind, neem etc. and spread the message "Make, Tie & Sow.
3. **Green Gansha Rally & My Bappa** – Ganesh Chaturthi celebrations culminate in the immersion of Ganesh idol into rivers, lakes, sea or ponds. As most of idols are made from POP, toxic chemical colors. These idols are non-degradable and harmful to environment. To create awareness in and around the village to use clay Ganesha and sale the Clay idols every year, Students and teachers buy idol from the stall of green army.
4. **Rain water Harvesting-** The College is recently working towards the creation of an infrastructure to facilitate rain water harvesting project. The rain water from the roof top of the building collected in one pit near the bore well which increases level of water in the ground. The green grounds around the college building allow the rain water to percolate in the soil which maintained the ground water table.
5. **Eco-friendly Holi color making workshop:**

The organization of eco- friendly Holi color making workshop was planned with an intention to make aware the people about less toxic and natural alternatives of celebrating the festival of colors.

1. **Seedballs making activity:**

Before the arrival of monsoon Green Army club prepared seedballs and planned to throw them around the barren areas of Nandgaonkhandeshwar city. The survival and germination chances of seeds becomes fairly high and helps in reforestation.

1. **Energy Conservation:**

Conserving the conventional source of energy is the need of time hence Green Army club celebrates National Energy Conservation Day every year on 14th December to inculcate the idea of conserving energy and switching on to alternative sources of energy.

1. **Save soil:**

On the occasion of National Earth Day, a video was prepared by the Green Army members to spread the message of save soil.

1. **Safety measure workshop-Department of Chemistry:**

The department of chemistry has arranged special awareness programs on laboratory measures and disposal of chemical waste.

1. **Vermicomposting** – This unit has been successfully established in campus and product is put on sale to teachers and students to create awareness about organic farming.
2. **Plastic Eradication - Mitra:** Women cell had started Mitra project in 2019-20. Aim of this project is to create awareness against use of plastic bags. Students made paper bags from the newspaper

and distributed in medical stores and vegetable and fruit sellers. In next step, students those who know the stitching skill had made saree bags from waste sarees and sale it to medical stores and shops.

3. **Botanical Garden:** The department of Botany has also created a botanical garden and maintained medicinal plants. This initiative contributes to the expansion of the green campus of college and creates awareness of the medicinal plants and trees.

4. **Waste Management Campaign**

The college has taken initiative to create awareness amongst the citizens to implement segregation of solid waste and hand over plastic waste for recycling and safe disposal. College has installed incineration unit on the campus for hygiene and proper sanitation.

1. **Cleanliness drive:** The institute joins hands with the Swachh Bharat Mission Program. The college has received first prize from Nagarparishad of Nandgaonkh.

2. **Role in Pollution controlling** -The teaching and non-teaching staff adopt the carpooling system, this in turn will reduce CO2 emission. Most of the students rely on Public Transport to reach the campus.

Such an environmental supplement program inculcates an art of environment conservation among the students and makes them aware of their relationship with nature

5. **Evidence of Success:** Each initiative has undertaken by the College is a small step to contribute to save the Mother Earth. As these initiatives may take time to bring about significant changes, however the success is at the doorsteps. Following are the positive changes seen in the campus:

1. The ground water level increases and it is hoped that by early 2023 the project of rain water harvesting will be successfully implemented as planned.
2. Vermi-composting has been successfully implemented.
3. The citizens have built up the habit of waste segregations .
4. Diversity of flora and Fauna has significantly improved.
5. **“Ecoist**restoring the glory of mother Earth is the magazine published by Green Army club.

6. **Problems Encountered and Resources Required**

In rural area, it is difficult to educate local people about green initiatives this remains the biggest hurdle. Financial constraints remain the biggest problem for expensive green initiatives like rain water harvesting, solar panel remains.

Its our privilege thing is that number of admitted female students are more than 50% of total admissions from this backward area since from 2017.

In NandgaonKhandeshwartaluka most of the girl students get married after HSSC examination and the graph of that female student get stunted.
